It's completely free of charge.

You can register as many pets as you have. There are no specific requirements and no age limits.

We can care for all pets - from dogs and cats to gerbils, lizards and budgies.

Your questions answered

How will my family know that I have Forever Care?

You should notify your next of kin, family, friends or neighbours of your wishes for your pet(s). They can phone us on 03000 999 999 and we'll arrange to collect your pet(s).

How long will it take to pick up my pet(s)?

We'll pick up your animal(s) as soon as we can after receiving a call from your next of kin. Normally this happens within 24 hours. Your pet(s) will be taken to one of our rescue and rehoming centres. This is usually the centre nearest to where you live.

How long will my pet stay in a rehoming centre before going to a new home?

Your pet(s) will stay in our care until we've found the right new home.
Rest assured, your pet will be well looked after by our dedicated staff and volunteers until they leave our care and go to their new family.

Will you be able to keep my animals together when they go to their new home?

Let us know on your Forever Care form if it's important to you that your animals stay together. We'll always try to keep your pets together and would only separate them in the best interests of their welfare.

How will my Executor know if I have signed up my pet(s) to Forever Care?

When you register for Forever Care, you'll get a welcome letter and a special Forever Care card. You might want to keep it with your Will. It's also a good idea to let a a close friend or family member know about Forever Care if you're unable to tell your Executor of your wishes.
